Most of these references belonged to 3 central narratives:



1. Warning – people will be forced to flee their homes due to climate change



2. Prevention – climate mitigation policies are automatically actions to prevent displacement



3. Cooperation – policy responses require working together, especially within Europe



The narratives are built around either fear of climate change impacts (and the effects they will have



on people's lives and livelihoods) or fear of refugees and migrants coming to Europe from the Global South.

## **#PARTICIPANTSWANTED -**RESEARCHING NATIONAL POLITICS **DURING A PANDEMIC**

- More difficult to access parliamentarians
- Less likely to agree to online interviews/surveys than in-person interactions
- Outreach via email, social media and videos required on larger scale than prepandemic



## NEXT STEPS **IDEALISED DISCOURSE TYPES USING Q METHOD**

Parliamentarians are being asked to sort statements about climate change and migration according to level of agreement. Statistical analysis will be used to distil ideal 'types' from the data.
